Highlights include:</p> <p>CSA data can be used to support AHA's Target Stroke, Stroke Systems of Care, and the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment's Burden Report. Items that can be focused on include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ensure data quality - Extract information from data - Use information to guide policy - Monitor real-world effects of policies in order to guide continual, systematic improvement of the overall system of care <p>Dr Smith reviewed a possible system reporting format that could be used to support stroke efforts in Colorado.</p> <p>CSA Should Define: Items to measure; Means of reporting on items; Overall benchmark for items</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Does this report capture what's important re tPA? - Is ranking sites the best way of benchmarking? - Challenges - Verifying data accuracy - Alternative databases - Competitiveness - Sharing best practices - Temptation to use these data not for system improvement, but for economic advantage - Maintaining the ability to extract information going forward <p>No other comments/feedback provided.</p>
